





2018 Healthy Aging Initiative

Improve access and availability of integrated, comprehensive services for older adults and their caregivers, delivered in a person-centered way.

Healthy Aging

Improve the health and wellbeing of older adults.

INNOVATION: Develop and pilot a new model to better support older adults that may involve nontraditional partners.

ACCESS: Improve access to current or expanded service array. This could be done through technology advancements, the integration of aging services into other health systems, increased workforce availability, or other strategies.

SYSTEMS: Address the structural barriers and inefficiencies that prevent various systems (e.g., education, health, social) from delivering care to older adults.

ISSUES: Address a significant issue area (e.g., social isolation) or various health disparities impacting older adults.



Caregiving

Increase support for formal and informal caregivers.



The Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation is generously providing \$1 million in additional funding for caregiving proposals



Caregiver Proposals

- **INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE:** Improve caregivers' access to resources.
- **ASSESSMENTS:** Provide caregivers with routine family-centered assessments to offer appropriate services reflecting specific needs.
- **HOME-BASED OR COMMUNITY SERVICE DELIVERY:** Assistance in early planning or respite coordination to avert crises.



Systems Change



What is a system?

A set of things – people, cells, molecules, etc. – interconnected in such a way that they produce their own patterns of behavior over time.


What is systemic change?

The emergence of a new pattern of organization or system structure. Often long-term, big picture, structural.




Systems of Healthy Aging

- All of our grantees work in systems:
 - **Healthcare:** Hospital, primary care, behavioral health
 - **Education:** Colleges/universities, training programs
 - **Aging services:** Home and community-based
 - **State/federally-funded programs:** Medicaid, Medicare
 - **Residential:** Skilled nursing, assisted living
- All focused on imbedding change within long-standing systems
- How do all of these different systems work together collectively to better support older adults?






Age-Friendly Health Systems


- Develop large-scale approaches that help health systems transform care;
- Operationalize the essential elements of good care, building on the Foundation's investments in evidence-based models and best practices; and
- Better integrate community-based supports and services within the health system and across the continuum of care.



Family Caregiving



- Improve the ability of health systems and providers to identify, assess, and support family caregivers;
- Raise awareness among policymakers, health system leaders, funders, and the public to drive change; and
- Create large-scale change in partnership with national efforts.



Helpful Tips

- Clearly identify if you are applying under **Healthy Aging** or **Caregiving**.
- You must address one of our two **cross-cutting goals**.
- Clearly identify the **issue** you will be addressing.
- Think about your initiative in terms of **long-term, sustainable impact**.
- **Collaboration** is key.
- **Health outcomes** matter.


